| April 1942 | - " <i>The Great Man's Lady</i> " |
| August 1942 | - " <i>The Gay Sisters</i> " |
| May 1943 | - " <i>Lady of Burlesque</i> " |
| September 1943 | - Stanwyck and Marx sell last of Marwyck land |
